# International Union of Radioecology

#### Goals of the IUR:

- ensuring, stimulating and maintaining high level radioecological expertise throughout the world to secure the safe development of nuclear based technologies and the public awareness and acceptance.
- promoting scientific innovation, identifying research priorities and stimulating the co-construction of international programmes sharing resources and research infrastructures.
- perpetuating and strengthening its network of scientists and professionals for the benefit of all members and member countries.
- liaising with other relevant international organisations, whether focused on science, operational radioecology, or regulation for radiation protection.



#### **IUR Global Forum**

- International Workshop on harmonization of radioecology networks, June 2014
- Established IUR FORUM

#### **Key Outcomes:**

- Communication, both among regional and technical radioecology networks and with other networks with an interest in the application of the results of radioecology;
- 2. Global integration and construction of consensus on key scientific radioecology issues; and
- 3. Maintenance of expertise.
