FOCUS

- IUR Regional Forum "Strengthening Radioecology in the Asia-Pacific" Bali, Indonesia 4 September 2016
 The SPERA Conference was held in cooperation with the Indonesian National Nuclear Energy Agency (BATAN) and the Australian Radiation Protection and Nuclear Safety Agency (ARPANSA) and the 2nd International Conference on the Sources, Effects and Risks of Ionizing Radiation (SERIR). Following the International Workshop on « Worldwide Harmonization of Radioecology Networks » hosted by the IUR in Aix en Provence, France, in June 2014, dedicated to initiate the establishment of a IUR Global FORUM, this joint-Conference in Asia provided an opportunity to hold a « IUR Regional Forum ».
- Congressional Briefing "The role of Radioecology in National Security", Capitol Hill, Washington DC (USA)
 6 October 2016

One main goal was to attract the attention of high level politicians to the need for re-allocating substantial funds to radioecology research and development in the US. IUR was invited to give a lecture addressing "Radioecology and our future: Radioecology's contribution to preserving ecosystem health" (by F. Bréchignac).

 AERC-IUR workshop on "Integration of Ecosystem Science Research into Radioecology of the Nuclear AgeEnvironmental radioactivity", Aiken, South Carolina, USA - 2-5 October 2016

AERC (Association of Ecosystem Research Centers) and IUR (International Union of radioecology) decided to hold a joint Workshop, where a broad audience of radioecologists, ecosystem ecologists and toxicologists has been invited to brainstorm on a better integration of ecosystem science into radioecology. The goal of the workshop was to facilitate networking of scientists working in the areas of radioecology and ecosystem research and to produce a white paper for publication stemming from recommendations generated at the event

Challenges ahead for IUR

International Union of Radioecology

- Strengthening the FORUM network (currently 16 member networks) with new international initiatives Hold the 2^d FORUM Meeting in 2018
- Broadening scientific linkage to sister organisations dealing with environmental risk (UNEP, SETAC,...) to support the development of Ecological Risk Assessment concepts, tools and expertise

International Union of Radioecology

- Prepare for organizing the Arctic and Antarctic International Conference in 2018
- Further developing an ecosystem approach to support Environmental Risk Assessment with view on relating ecological impacts of radiation to loss of ecosystem services and life support functions
- Initiate proper conceptualization of human and environment integrated risk assessment to orient R&D developments best suited to adapted regulatory applications





Outline of the programme for 2017



- IUR Awards On the occasion of the ICRER 2017 Conference in Berlin, Germany, the 5th IUR Vernadsky Award and five IUR Young Investigator Awards to be awarded.
- IUR Workshop « Radiobiology meets Radioecology », 16-17 September 2017 Essen, Germany On the occasion of the joint meeting ERRS 2017 & GBS 2017 which brings together the 43rd Annual Meeting of the European Radiation Research Society and the 20th Annual Meeting of the Society for Biological Radiation Research, a satellite IUR Workshop "Radiobiology meets Radioecology" took place. The aim of the workshop is to discuss some of the challenges in understanding the role of low dose radiobiological effects in impacting outcome of radiation exposure in ecosystems.
- International Workshop « Regulatory Supervision of Legacy Sites: the Process from Recognition to Resolution », organised by the NRPA in cooperation with the IAEA, ICRP, NEA and IUR, 21-23 November 2017 Lillehammer, Norway

The importance of a well-established process for legacy management has been highlighted by previous developments. The significant support of IUR in identifying research needs, radioecological innovation and liaising the particular scientific outputs with relevant international organizations, focused, among others, on regulations and radiation protection has been given internationally through several IUR's task groups.



- Promote further the FORUM assigned to support international harmonisation of radioecology networks – Asian and Australasian network re-launched: Drafting a SRA planned. Decision made to hold a second and enlarged FORUM Meeting in 2017
- Continue the prioritisation process for efficient research and development in Radioecology worldwide
- Finalize the publication of the position paper from the AERC-IUR Workshop on integration of ecosystem science into radioecology of the nuclear age organized at Savannah River Ecology Laboratory, Aike, South Carolina, USA, October 2016
- Continue to sponsor Radioeocological initiatives (conferences, workshops, courses,...)
- Stimulate the emergence of new innovative Task Groups
- Push publication from TG outputs (waste, non-lethal methods, ecosystem approach, radioecology in arid regions, ...)
- Improve administrative efficiency of the Union, including attraction of more sponsors, wider and active membership
